The Royal Funeral took place October 25th through October 29th, with the actual cremation held on October 26th. During that time people in the nation returned to wearing black as a sign of respect and mourning. This great King forever changed this country.

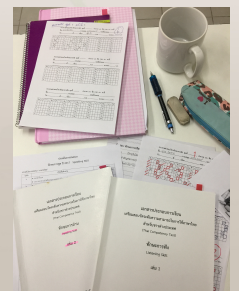
